We welcome parents and candidates to Confirmation preparation!

As a parish we want to journey with our candidates as they prepare for the sacrament of Confirmation which brings them into full communion with the Church. Your student's faith journey will be nurtured toward understanding and living their faith. It will be a time of searching, challenging, learning, and resolving their faith. Your active support and encouragement will enhance the process. As your child's relationship with Christ and with our parish communities grow, they will look to you as their example.

Weekly Mass attendance is very important. Our Church is a worshipping community. Faith and worship are closely linked. Faith brings the community together to worship; and in worship faith is renewed. The Church celebrates Christ's life, death, and Resurrection in its liturgy. It proclaims its faith in His presence in the Church, in His Word, in the sacramental celebrations; it gives praise and thanks, asks for the things it needs, and strengthens itself to carry out its commission to be witnesses to do service. It is VITAL that students see faith development as LIFE-LONG, and that one must strive continuously to grow in faith, throughout adulthood. Our faith journey does not end as long as we are living.

Catholic School Student Confirmation Prep 2023/24



Confirmation Year 2 Study Guide

All candidates will attend an in-person interview in April or May. Candidates will bring a parent or adult family member with them. This interview is to ensure that all candidates have been properly prepared to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Be prepared for your interview! All candidates are required to know and understand basic Catholic information and prayers. To help you prepare, here is a study guide. We encourage you to pray daily and study this information with your parents and sponsor.

Confirmation Study Guide

Why do you wish to be confirmed?

Gifts of the Holy Spirit:

Wisdom is the gift of knowing the right choices to make to live a holy life. The gift of wisdom helps you to avoid the things that could lead you away from God.

Understanding is the gift of comprehension, or the ability to grasp the meaning of the teachings of the Church. The gift of understanding helps you be tolerant and sympathetic of others. It helps you sense when someone is hurting or in need of compassion.

Right Judgment, or Counsel, is the gift of prudence. The gift of right judgment helps you make choices to live as a faithful follower of Jesus.

Courage, or Fortitude, is the gift that helps you stand up for your faith in Christ. The gift of courage helps you overcome any obstacles that would keep you from practicing your faith.

Knowledge is the gift of knowing and enlightenment. The gift of knowledge enables you to choose the right path that will lead you to God.

Reverence, or Piety, is the gift of confidence in God. This gift of reverence inspires you to joyfully want to serve God and others.

Wonder and Awe, or Fear of the Lord is the gift of wonder and respect that encourages you to be in awe of God. The gift of wonder and awe moves you to so love God that you do not want to offend him by your words or actions.

Confirmation Rehearsal and Mass Information

Confirmation Mass usually lasts about an hour and 20 minutes.

There is a light reception after Mass in the Cushing Center across from church. All are welcome!

Confirmandi dress code: Sunday Mass attire. No jeans, tennis shoes, low cut, off the shoulder, strapless or short dresses.

The Bishop will anoint your forehead with oil; make sure your hair is out of the way!

Rehearsal

- Confirmandi and their sponsors attend.
- Rehearsal lasts about 45 minutes and is usually a day or two before Confirmation Mass.
- If a sponsor is unable to attend, a parent may stand in.
- Family seating is chosen at rehearsal.
 - o Please consider how many will be attending and choose a pew accordingly.
 - Only one pew per family will be reserved. There will be extra seating in the outer sections.
 - o Name plaques will be hung on the end of pews so family will be able to find you before Mass!
- Candidates sit on the end of the pew with their sponsor beside them.
- We will need 4 people to carry up the gifts. If you'd like to do so, let the Faith Formation department know and we'll provide instructions after the rehearsal.

Confirmation Mass

- Please arrive a half hour before Mass.
- Confirmandi, pick up your nametag as you enter the church. It will have your Confirmation name on it.
- Please keep socializing and conversation in the church to a minimum before Mass.
 - We are setting an example for those who are not Catholic, and being respectful to those who would like to pray and ready themselves for Mass. You're welcome to hold conversations outside!
- No food or drink in church, and no gum chewing. Remember to fast (no eating or drinking one hour before Communion).
- Guests who are not Catholic are welcome to come up in the Communion line with their arms crossed to receive
 a blessing.
- Your Confirmation certificate will be in your pew. Please remember to take it home with you.
- We ask that no photos be taken during Mass. Feel free to take pictures before and after Mass.
- All candidates and their sponsors will process out together at the end of Mass. Walk down the center aisle
 before the Bishop and priests exit, going to the statue of Mary outside for a group picture which will be emailed
 to you.
- Please walk over to the Cushing Center for light refreshments after Mass. All your guests are welcome!
